Apart from panning for (real) gold and visiting an underground mine, you could easily get lost for a day or two discovering tunnels, old-fashioned streetscapes and a swag of experiences, from dipping candles and riding a stage coach through the busy street, to going underground on a fully guided Secret Chamber tram ride

The city of Ballarat retains much of its historical charm, with grand thoroughfares and hidden laneways. Galleries, eateries and architecture pay heed to days of yesteryear, while leafy gardens provide shady refuge and a local wildlife park hosts more than 100 roaming kangaroos.

To fully immerse oneself in Ballarat's opulent past, book a night or two in the Royal Suite at Craig's Royal Hotel and find yourself surrounded by beautifully restored 1850s décor.

Outside of town, discover a contemporary vibe in many nearby villages, where heritage trails, outdoor walks, local foodie haunts and renowned boutique wineries reflect an unspoken richness and depth of character. Creswick is a must stop destination and is home of the Creswick Woollen Mills. Meet the resident alpacas and purchase Australian products made onsite at the Mill.

MELBOURNE - GREAT OCEAN ROAD - GRAMPIANS

DAY 1

Melbourne to Great Ocean Road

Depart:	Melbourne
O/night:	Port Campbell
Distance:	279 kilometres

Start your bucket-list drive west towards Werribee's open plains. Join an Echidna Walkabout nature tour to see koalas and kangaroos in natural habitats then explore Geelong Waterfront's sparkling bayside

Road trip the Surf Coast, through Torquay, Anglesea and onto lovely Lorne for lunch. Detour to Cape Otway Lightstation for brilliant ocean views, before catching sunset over the Twelve Apostles and settling in for the night at Port Campbell's Southern Ocean Villas or Anchors Port Campbell.

DAY 1 Melbourne to Great Ocean Road

Depart:	Melbourne
O/night:	Anglesea
Distance:	114 kilometres

A 30-minute Princes Highway drive and you arrive at Werribee Open Range Zoo in time for an open-air African safari adventure. Motor on to Geelong's glittering waterfront and explore the Bollards Trail before a view-laden lunch on the restaurant strip. Take the Surf Coast Highway to Torquay, the spiritual home of Australian Surfing and onto Anglesea.

Experience chocolate like never before at the **Great Ocean Road Chocolaterie**. Enjoy a well-earned night of peaceful snoozing at **Great Ocean Road Resort**.

DAY 2 Great Ocean Road to Grampians

DAY 1 Melbourne to Queenscliff

Depart:	Melbourne

Distance:	107 kilometres
